

Academy parents, please join us for a special information night next Tuesday evening, April 20, at 7:00 pm in the Common Room. The highlight of the program will be a "State of the School" presentation by our pastor Father Phillips and our headmaster Ralph Johnston. This presentation will discuss the current status and future strategic planning for our academy. This program will present some important new information that will be of interest to many in our parish and school community.

In recent months, the academy administrative team, in consultation with the School Council and with the assistance of an architect, has done some significant strategic planning for the future growth and ultimate size of our school. This planning has addressed enrollment, academics, athletics, and site constraints, and has defined our need for additional facilities. The presentation by Father Phillips and Mr. Johnston will summarize this recent work and will present the future plans. This will be the first time that much of this information has been presented outside of the administrative team and School Council. Father Phillips and the leadership of the school and PTC felt that it was important to make this information widely available.

In addition to the presentation on the state of the school, there will be some PTC business, including volunteer recognition and an opportunity to participate in the nomination of PTC officers for next year.

Students are welcome to attend, though the program is unlikely to hold the interest of students younger than around 5th grade. Child care will be available for younger children.

> Coach Cortez was iInducted into the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in February 2010.



Joseph "Joe" Cortez coached the Central Catholic High School basketball team for 36 years. Cortez went 823-443 in 40 seasons -- he coached four years at Peacock Military Academy before moving to Central Catholic in 1960 -- and his victory total ranks No. 1 in San Antonio high school basketball history. Central Catholic was 791-404 under Cortez, winning 10 Texas Catholic Interscholastic League championships and city crowns in 1967 and 1975.

He was inducted into the Latin American International Sports Hall of Fame in 1983. Cortez was an all-state basketball player at Central Catholic before going on to play at Texas.
